

HIKING AT HOLCOMB FARM

Spend an hour or an afternoon. The trails are open to the public daily from dawn to dusk, 365 days a year. Some trails have moderate elevation gains. Hiking, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and horseback riding are encouraged. Bicycles and motorized vehicles are prohibited. All trails are marked by colored blazes. Horses are allowed on all trails and additional horse trails are marked by white dots. Horses are not allowed on trail bridges.



- We offer public education, through a wide range of programs on farming, food preservation, wildlife protection, and more.
- We steward the property upon which Holcomb Farm sits, including its beautiful, 10-mile trail system.



WELCOME TO HOLCOMB FARM

Holcomb Farm encompasses more than 300 acres of farmland, rolling hills, meadows, woodland, and clear brooks. Holcomb Farm sits between Granby Land Trust lands and the McLean Game Refuge, forming an important area of open space and protected land in Granby.

Seven generations of Holcombs farmed this land, from 1719 until 1976, before siblings Tudor and Laura Holcomb gave the farm to the public to be used for agricultural and educational purposes.
